Shotgun Range Rules

General

- The range is open to the public during specified shoot days and times
- The range can be used by association members who have received keys, machine operation orientation and financial responsibility training during other times with notification to the director of shotguns sports or his designee and will be designated as range assistants.
- Only range assistants will be issued keys and will be part of the trap or skeet committee.
- Association members shall be able to produce their membership id if requested by any member.
- Shooting hours are from 9 AM to one half hour before sunset Sunday through Saturday, except for scheduled events. Closed for Easter and Christmas.
- Shot size no larger than 7 ½ on the trap and skeet fields.
- Shotguns will be unloaded with the action visible or hinge gun open with the muzzle pointed in a safe direction at all times when not actively shooting. This does not apply when guns are placed in acceptable gun rack.
- No one under the influence of alcohol or illicit drugs may handle or utilize the range at anytime.
- Shoot fees shall be paid by way of cash, check or punch card at the end of the business day. Anyone who neglects their financial responsibility shall be subject to club termination and or legal prosecution.

Guns

- Acceptable firearms are any shotgun that is in good working order – hinge, semi-auto or pump action are acceptable. Firearms capable of firing shot shells are also acceptable. No fully automatic weapons will be allowed for any reason.
- No more than 2 shells are to be loaded into a gun on the range without permission of the range officer, director of shotgun sports or his designee.

Fields

- Eye and hearing protection is required on ranges – no exceptions
- Only clay targets allowed. No other material accepted as targets.
- It is the shooter's responsibility to pick up any shell boxes, shell cases or other material left by them while on the ranges.
- If an orange cone is displayed on top of a trap house or by a skeet house, no shooting will commence until the cone is removed and range is clear.
- A trapper may remain inside the trap house or skeet houses during events to load machines so as not to delay a registered event.
